Z is for first grade zest. We're ready, have no fear!





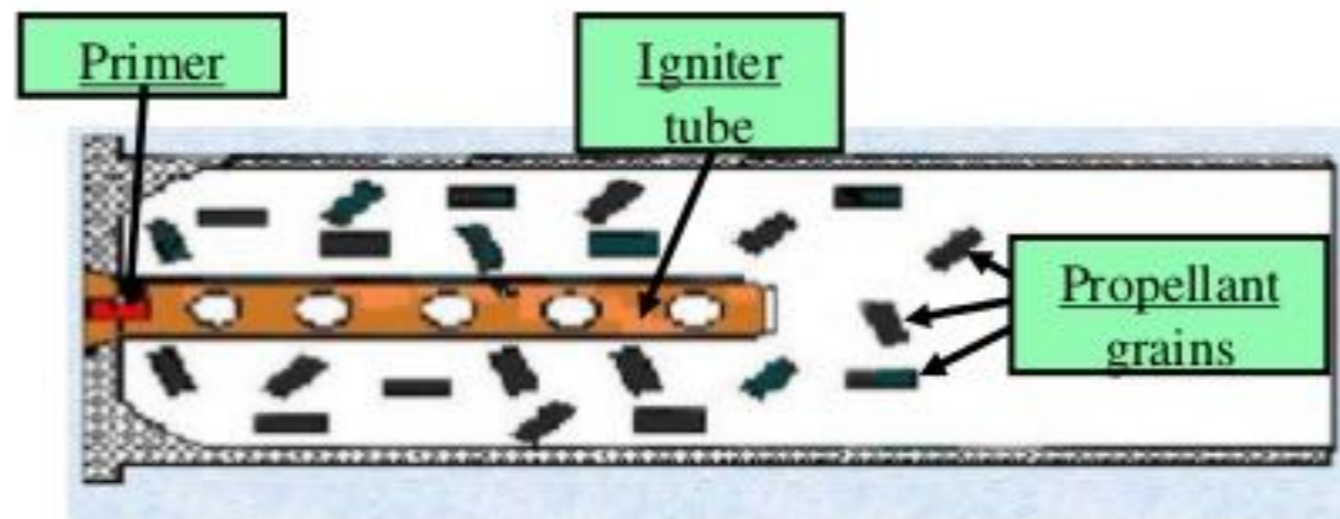

Explosive Train - Propelling



Primer is initiated by external source (e.g., firing pin, electric current)
