2nd Week of Easter

1 John 1:1-2:2

“God is Light and in Him there is no darkness at all” (1:5). Everything hinges on this gracious truth and revolves around this light that emanates from God. The light most visible on the second Sunday of Easter is the light of the resurrection, still fresh in our minds and still causing us to blink as we adjust to the new reality it reveals (James D. Freeman, 2008, p398).

God’s great desire is fellowship with us. He is merciful, sending His Son to reconcile the whole world to restored relationship with Him. We have access to the Father through the Son’s gift of atonement, or “at-one-ment” —fellowship instead of brokenness.

How will we respond?

Will we trust God for healing of our sin-habit?

Through the love and care of us all, God can act and become present to those in need, both healing and restoring. We trust God to answer our prayers of healing, but we do not now ho or when our prayers will be answered. We simply trust God to act in love for us, out of a deeper knowledge of our needs than we ourselves have. We know too, that to be involved in healing ministry requires our willingness to be involved in the process of change—change which may involve us in actions as well as prayer (The Iona Community Worship Book, 1988, p36).
