

Luke 16:10-15; Matthew 25:14

Our spiritual life is God's affair; because, whatever we may think to the contrary, it is really produced by His steady attraction, and our humble and self-forgetful response to it. It consists in being drawn, at His pace, and in His way, to the place where He wants us to be; not the place we fancied for ourselves (E. Underhill 1937).

The key is found in Luke 16:10-12. It's about faithfulness. Money is not a possession, it's a trust: God entrusts property to people and expects it to be used to His glory and the welfare of His children, not for private glory or glamor. Money also—according to this passage—points beyond itself, to true riches awaiting us in the life to come. What they are, we can hardly guess; but they are 'true riches' which really will belong to us, in a way money doesn't, if we learn faithfulness here and now (N.T. Wright, 2001).

There is nothing like losing everything to heal you of fear and to learn that you have enough, each day. My life is full of joy! Would I like an actual office rather than a desk in our crowded unfinished basement with clotheslines on which I hang my socks? Sure! But whether I have it or not makes absolutely no difference to me: This is what I have today, and I am so grateful for it, so full of thanksgiving. Tomorrow is a myth and drunk driver or a little wayward cell in my body could obliterate any expectation I could have. I only have grace for today, and in embracing a life being loved. I am FREE (Wm. Paul Young, 2006)!

How can I become even more faithful to use the resources entrusted to me for the sake of Christ and His children?
